Financial Support for Families

Waverley Meadows Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF). If you are a health care holder please ask for an application form from the office. If eligible a payment of \$125 per child is payable to the school which can be applied to the cost of camps, excursions, and activities that your child would attend.
- **State Schools Relief (SSR).** Applications are submitted by schools. The program covers costs such as new school uniform, shoes for families under severe financial hardship.
- **Payment plans for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities.** Please speak with our office staff to discuss options.

Payment methods

The preferred method of payment at our school is online via the Compass Portal.

Payments can be made upfront, or by a payment plan allowing smaller transaction totals throughout the year. Payments can also be made via EFTPOS at the School Office.

Option #1

Pay the selected amount in full via Compass or EFTPOS.

Option #2

Payment Plan Instalments available on the 15th of each month from 15th Feb to 15th May 2024. 25% equal monthly instalments will be automatically debited from your nominated bank card. This option is available for selection via the Compass Portal only.

Option #3

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
